2.	Tuition	Tuition-free until graduation or disenrollment	While a full time student, full tuition and reimbursement for required books, fees and academic expenses.
3.	Books/instruments	Free to students	School-required fees and expenses; rental fees for microscopes and computers
4.	Computers	Computer resources available at school in library and in Student Center; students may buy their own laptops	Computer availability varies with school; students may buy their own laptops – not reimbursed by HPSP. \$250/year reimbursed for lease only.
5.	Pay	Full O-1 pay with or without dependents + BAH and BAS. 2008 estimates are \$4325 per month without dependents, \$4625 per month with.	\$1900.00 stipend per month for 10½ months; 45 days active duty pay as an O-1 + BAH and BAS (partial if government housing provided) - students can earn approximately \$24,000.00 per year
6.	Service Obligation	7 years Active Duty after graduate medical education, remainder to 14 years served in the Individual Ready Reserve. GME-1 and GME2+ does not relieve obligation; GME2+ incurs additional obligation, but served concurrently with residual USUHS obligation.	4 years Active Duty after graduate medical education (one year for each year of scholarship benefits or the length of GME2+ residency program, whichever is greater) remainder up to 8 years in the Individual Ready Reserve. Active duty GME-1 and GME2+ relieve IRR obligation; active duty GME2+ incurs additional obligation, but served concurrently with residual HPSP obligation.

Benefits	Active Duty benefits for self and dependents; low cost life insurance; free and convenient health care available on campus for self and dependents; commissary and base exchange privileges unlimited.	Active Duty benefits for self only when on 45 days of active duty; base exchange and commissary privileges even when not on active duty (with I.D. card); will pay for single rate health insurance when required by school
8.	GME deferments	Not eligible for 1-year or full deferments.	Eligible for 1-year and full deferments.
9.	Career Planning	Mentored throughout medical school for potential career in military medicine; opportunities for operational activities readily available	Mentored by civilian medical school, recruiter and HPSP liaison from each branch of service with contact availability to physicians for mentoring, internet HPSP web site with program hand book & detailed information , check with each branch for specific career mentoring & support
