The American Medical Student Association was founded in 1950. With a half-century history of medical student activism, AMSA is the nation's oldest and largest independent association of future physicians. AMSA is a student-governed, national organization committed to representing the concerns of all physicians-in-training.

The Board of Trustees governs the organization and ten action committees produce programming. The House of Delegates is AMSA's official policy-making body, where members from each local medical chapter meet once a year to vote on AMSA's policies and to elect national officers.
