WHEREAS community water fluoridation is supported by nearly every public health, medical, and dental organization, including the American Dental Association, American Academy of Pediatrics, US Public Health Service, and World Health Organization; and (3)		
WHEREAS community water fluoridation has been shown to save money for families and for the US healthcare system; and (3)
