- SCHOOL: Nova Southeastern University College of Osteopathic Medicine SUBJECT: Principles Regarding Human Trafficking (HT) and Commercially and Sexually Exploited Children (CSEC) TYPE: **Resolution of Principles** WHEREAS survivors of human trafficking endure an unspeakable amount of pain and trauma; 1 2 and 3 WHEREAS sometimes, traffickers even force their victims to commit crimes as a way to further 4 5 victimize them 6 7 WHEREAS often, they are arrested for crimes they were forced to commit by their traffickers; 8 and 9 10 WHEREAS even after they are able to leave their trafficking situations, these criminal records haunt them for the rest of their lives: and 11 12 WHEREAS convictions, and even an arrest record, can limit access to opportunities such as jobs, 13 loans, education, housing, or visas; and 14 15 16 WHEREAS victims of human trafficking are victims - not criminals; and 17 WHEREAS particularly when non-violent crimes are the issue, they should receive protection 18 and support, not punishment and stigma, 19 20 **THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that the Principles on Human Trafficking (HT) and 21 Commercially and Sexually Exploited Children (CSEC) (pp 161-162) be AMENDED BY 22 ADDITION state: 23 The American Medical Student Association: 24 25 2.
