INTRODUCED BY: Kelly Thibert DO, MPH, National President; SCHOOL: Nova Southeastern University College of Osteopathic Medicine SUBJECT: Principles Regarding Human Trafficking (HT) and Commercially and Sexually Exploited Children (CSEC) TYPE: Resolution of Principles WHEREAS survivors of human trafficking endure an unspeakable amount of pain and trauma; WHEREAS sometimes, traffickers even force their victims to commit crimes as a way to further victimize them WHEREAS often, they are arrested for crimes they were forced to commit by their traffickers; WHEREAS even after they are able to leave their trafficking situations, these criminal records haunt them for the rest of their lives; and WHEREAS convictions, and even an arrest record, can limit access to opportunities such as jobs, loans, education, housing, or visas; and WHEREAS victims of human trafficking are victims - not criminals; and WHEREAS particularly when non-violent crimes are the issue, they should receive protection and support, not punishment and stigma, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Principles on Human Trafficking (HT) and Commercially and Sexually Exploited Children (CSEC) (pp 161-162) be AMENDED BY ADDITION state: The American Medical Student Association: 2. In regard to legislation: d. ENCOURAGES legislation in which victims of human trafficking can request the court vacate their federal criminal convictions and expunge their arrests for non-violent crimes committed as a "direct result of the person having been a victim of trafficking."
