THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Principles Regarding Vivisection in Medical Education (p. 102) be AMENDED BY DELETION of the following: 5. Regarding mandatory participation in animal laboratories: d. URGES the University Of Colorado School Of Medicine, the Uniformed Services University of Health Sciences, F. Edward Herbert School of Medicine, and the University Of Nevada School Of Medicine to immediately rescind the requirement for medical students to participate in laboratories using live animals as a requisite for advancement within the school.
