SUBJECT:	Revocation of Chapter Charter

WHEREAS it is the responsibility of the Board of Trustees (BOT) to ensure that AMSA policy is upheld and that AMSA members have access to the rights and benefit afforded to them, and;

WHEREAS this sometimes includes addressing concerns regarding chapter practices that are in violation of AMSA policies, and;

WHEREAS the current language regarding the handling and compliance of these matters inappropriately designates this responsibility to "the national office" rather than the BOT and;

WHEREAS there is vague language regarding the circumstances warranting suspension or revocation of a charter by this
process or by the House of Delegates, creating the opportunity for confusion and potential harm to our chapter and
members.

14 **THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that the Constitution and Bylaws, Article V, Section 1 be amended to read:

The national office Board of Trustees reserves the right to review and demand correction of any gross violation of either AMSA policy—or basic democratic philosophy. In worst case scenarios the national office Board of Trustees (by at least two-thirds vote) reserves the right to revoke the charter of any chapter that either refuses to rectify a -any heinous-situation after being the chapter is notified by the national office or one that has done such damage through the misuse of authority and/or of AMSA's name that the national office Board of Trustees deems it prudent to discontinue association with the chapter. Furthermore, the charter of any chapter may be suspended or revoked by the House of Delegates, independent of

the Board of Trustees, upon a vote to that effect by at least three fourths (3/4) of those voting.
