11 12 13	WHEREAS Washington, D.C. has a population of more than 700,000 residents who currently do not have full representation in the United States government. Although they have a delegate in the House, they do not have a voting member in Congress or representation in the Senate [1,2].
14 15 16	WHEREAS the population of Washington, D.C. is greater than the populations of both Wyoming and Vermont. Alaska has a similar sized population of more than 730,000 residents. All three of these states have a voting member of Congress as well as two senators [2].
17 18	WHEREAS Washington, D.C. is the only capital of a democracy with no voting representation in the national legislature [3].
19 20 21	WHEREAS Washington, D.C. residents do not have a voice in Senate Committees or on the Senate Floor. They also have no say in the determination of who should serve as leadership for federal agencies, U.S. Ambassadors to foreign countries, on federal court benches, or in the U.S. Supreme Court [4].
22 23	WHEREAS Washington, D.C. residents pay more taxes than residents in 22 states and pay more federal taxes per capita than any other state. This is an example of 'taxation without representation' [3,4].
24 25	WHEREAS 200,000 of Washington, D.C. residents have served in the United States Armed Forces and 30,000 veterans live in Washington, D.C. [3].
26 27	WHEREAS in the 2016 referendum, 86% of Washington, D.C. residents voted in favor of making D.C. the 51st state [4].
28 29	WHEREAS the lack of representation in Washington, D.C. is a disenfranchisement of Black Americans. D.C. is historically a black city, with 47% of the population being Black. [4].
