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18	WHEREAS there is a national shortage of sexual assault (SA) forensic nurses that can perform
19	rape kits for sexual assault survivors.[1]
20	WHIEDEAS the exament charters of SA formula manage compositive manage of color has compositive
21 22	WHEREAS the current shortage of SA forensic nurses, especially nurses of color, has especially posed ramifications for survivors from underrepresented communities. For instance, Native
23	Americans are 2.5 times more likely to experience sexual assault in their lifetime, yet there is a
24	severe shortage of SA forensic nurses in tribal communities. [2]
25	severe shortage of 574 forensie narses in tribar communities. [2]
26	WHEREAS in New York City alone, over 50% of sexual assault survivors were African American
27	and 20% were LatinX in 2013. In interviews, these survivors stated that they would be more active
28	in seeking treatment if they were seen by SA forensic nurses who are also people of color. [3]
29	
30	WHEREAS stated in the National Protocol for Sexual Assault Medical Forensic Examinations, 40
31	hours of coursework is required for SA forensics certification. [4]
32	
33	WHEREAS 1 in 3 women and 1 in 4 men have experienced sexual violence in their lifetime. The
34	frequent occurrence of sexual violence highlights the urgency for increased SA forensics training
35	in medical school curriculum. [4]
36	
37	WHEREAS there are currently only 600 SA forensic nurse training programs in the U.S. out of
38	2,600 nursing programs. Furthermore, there are very few medical school curricula dedicated to
39	teaching trauma-informed care. [5]

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the PRINCIPLES REGARDING VIOLENCE AND HATE CRIMES (pg. 135-138) be AMENDED BY ADDITION to state:
