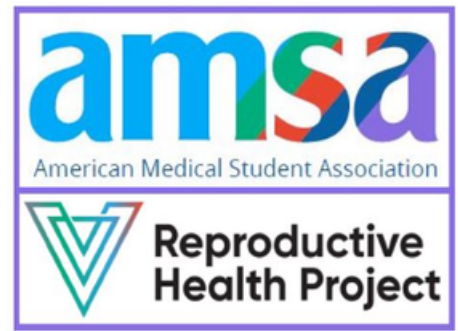


Repro Summer Crossword Puzzle



ANSWER GLOSSARY

Abortion - a medical intervention provided to individuals who need to end the medical condition of pregnancy. <https://www.acog.org/contact/media-center/abortion-language-guide>

Contraception - devices, medicines or procedures used to prevent pregnancies, with the beginning of pregnancy defined as implantation. <https://www.contraceptiveaccess.org/glossary>

Doula - a person who gives emotional support during pregnancy, labor, and childbirth and for some time after. <https://www.plannedparenthoodaction.org/glossary>

Ectopic - a life-threatening pregnancy that develops outside the uterus, often in a fallopian tube. <https://www.plannedparenthoodaction.org/glossary>

Embryo - the stage of development that starts at fertilization (joining of an egg and sperm). <https://www.contraceptiveaccess.org/glossary>

Fetus - the stage of human development beyond eight completed weeks after fertilization. This is the stage after pregnancy has begun. Medically, the beginning of pregnancy is called implantation. <https://www.contraceptiveaccess.org/glossary>

Implantation - the stage of pregnancy when the blastocyst attaches to the wall of the uterus. <https://www.acog.org/womens-health/dictionary>

Miscarriage - spontaneous loss of a pregnancy before the fetus is usually viable outside the uterus. <https://srhr.org/abortioncare/key-terms/glossary/>

Pregnancy - the gestational stage medically begins at implantation, during which a person carries a growing fetus in their uterus. <https://www.contraceptiveaccess.org/glossary>

Quickening - the moment during pregnancy when a pregnant person first notices the fetus moving in their uterus. <https://www.plannedparenthoodaction.org/glossary>

Transgender - term used to describe a person whose gender identity is different from the sex they were assigned at birth. <https://www.acog.org/womens-health/dictionary>

Vasectomy - permanent birth control method for males. In this procedure, a portion of the tube that carries sperm is removed. <https://www.acog.org/womens-health/dictionary>
